



REPORT ON ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL MANAGEMENT PLAN (ESMP)

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Introduction

There is an increasing number of international organizations that have adopted environmental and social safeguards policies to enhance suitable development benefits and avoid unnecessary harm to the environment and affected communities.

This document intends to provide detailed report on the steps that has been taken in the incorporation of the Environmental and Social Safeguards for the project "Enhancing the climate and disaster resilience of the most vulnerable rural and emerging urban human settlements in Lao PDR" funded by Adaptation Fund and lead by UN Habitat.

The framework in which this document has been developed has been in compliance with the Adaptation Fund Environmental and Social Policy¹, UN Habitat Environmental and Social Safeguards System², and the Lao PDR rules and regulations

Climate change is already causing economic loss and affecting the livelihoods of many people in Lao PDR. The frequency and intensity of climate related hazards such as droughts and floods are expected to increase in future, so Lao PDR must also urgently take steps to build its resilience by enhancing its adaptation efforts across all sectors.

The project aim to enhance the climate and disaster resilience across 189 most vulnerable human settlements in 8 districts of the southern provinces of Attape, Sekong and Saravane, by increasing sustainable access to basic infrastructure systems and services, emphasizing resilience to storms, floods, droughts, landslides and disease outbreaks. It combines several horizontally and vertically interrelated policy, planning and capacity development initiatives and has at its core the delivery of resilient infrastructure and services in target settlements that are characterized by a high exposure to climate hazards.

In order to ensure that the environmental and social concerns are addressed properly, all project activities have undergone screening, assessment, review, and clearance process before execution of the physical activities. The project will use a structured approach for environmental and social management to allow the project development process, following the hierarchy of avoidance, minimization and mitigation for negative impacts and enhancement of positive impacts.

Environmental and Social Framework

These safeguards policies allow the institutions to identify and manage the environmental and social risks of their activities, by assessing potential environmental and social harms and then by identifying and implementing steps to avoid, minimize, or mitigate those harms.

The environmental and social framework provides the necessary tools and procedures to screen, identify and manage the potential environmental and social risks of any project activities, providing practical guidance on achieving and demonstrating compliance with environmental and social policy trough out the project cycle whenever project implementation has the potential to trigger any environmental and/or social risks.

The environmental and social safeguards shall:

- i. Engage the affected community through disclosure of project related information and consultation on matters that directly affect them
- ii. Ensure that environmental and social risks are identified and assessed at the earliest possible stage of the project design.
- iii. Adopt measures to avoid or where the avoidance is impossible to minimize or mitigate those risk during the implementation, and
- iv. Monitor and report on the status of those measures during and at the end of the implementation

Environmental and Social Management Plan

During the project implementation, identify stakeholders have been involved since early stages in the activities planning. During environmental and social screening as well as in the environmental and social assessment, including any proposed management plan. There results of all these processes have been made available for public consultations in a timely, effective, inclusive manner, in an appropriate way for communities that are directly affected by the project proposed activity.

Screening: Identification of risk and applicable principles

All activities within the project have been screened to determine their potential to cause environmental or social harm. The screening process seek to identify potential environmental and social impacts and risks, taking into consideration the 15 principles defined by Adaptation Fund. The screening process have considered all potential direct, indirect, transboundary, and cumulative impacts produce by the proposed activity in the area of influence.

The 15 environmental and social principles proposed by the adaptation are the basis for identifying and managing environmental and social risks.

Adaptation Principle 1: Compliance with the Law

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be in compliance with all applicable domestic and international law.

Adaptation Principle 2: Access and equity

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall provide fair and equitable access to benefits in a manner that is inclusive and does not impede access to basic health services, clean water and sanitation, energy, education, housing, safe and decent working conditions, and land rights. Projects/programs should not exacerbate existing inequities, particularly with respect to marginalized or vulnerable groups.

Adaptation Principle 3: Vulnerable and marginalized groups

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall avoid imposing any disproportionate adverse impacts on marginalized and vulnerable groups including children, women and girls, the elderly, indigenous people, tribal groups, displaced people, refugees, people living with disabilities, and people living with HIV/AIDS.

Adaptation Principle 4: Human rights

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall respect and where applicable promote international human rights.

Adaptation Principle 5: Gender equality and women's empowerment

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be designed and implemented in such a way that both women and men 1) have equal opportunities to participate as per the Fund gender policy; 2) receive comparable social and economic benefits; and 3) do not suffer disproportionate adverse effects during the development process.

Adaptation Principle 6: Core labor rights

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund meet the core labor standards as identified by the International Labor Organization.

Adaptation Principle 7: Indigenous people

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be consistent with the rights and responsibilities set forth in the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and other applicable international instruments relating to indigenous peoples.

Adaptation Principle 8: Involuntary resettlement

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be designed and implemented in a way that avoids or minimizes the need for involuntary resettlement.

Adaptation Principle 9: Protection of natural habitats

The Fund shall not support projects/programs that would involve unjustified conversion or degradation of critical natural habitats, including those that are (a) legally protected; (b) officially proposed for protection; (c) recognized by authoritative sources for their high conservation value, including as critical habitat; or (d) recognized as protected by traditional or indigenous local communities.

Adaptation Principle 10: Conserving biodiversity

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be designed and implemented in a way that avoids any significant or unjustified reduction or loss of biological diversity or the introduction of known invasive species.

Adaptation Principle 11. Climate Change

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall not result in any significant or unjustified increase in greenhouse gas emissions or other causes of climate change.

Adaptation Principle 12. Pollution Prevention and Resource Efficiency

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be designed and implemented in a way that meets applicable international standards for maximizing energy efficiency and minimizing material resource use, the production of wastes, and the release of pollutants.

Adaptation Principle 13. Public Health

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be designed and implemented in a way that avoids potentially significant negative impacts on public health.

Adaptation Principle 14. Physical and Cultural Heritage

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be designed and implemented in a way that avoids the alteration, damage, or removal of any physical cultural resources, cultural sites, and sites with unique natural values recognized as such at the community, national or international level. Activities should also not permanently interfere with existing access and use of such physical and cultural resources.

Adaptation Principle 15. Lands and Soil Conservation

All the activities supported by the Adaptation Fund shall be designed and implemented in a way that promotes soil conservation and avoids degradation or conversion of productive lands or land that provides valuable ecosystem services.

Categorization

The outcome of the screening and assessment process is used to determine the environmental and social categorization of the risk for the project/programme.

All proposed activities were categorized according to the scale, nature and severity of their potential environmental and social impacts as follows:

Category A: The project activity is likely to have significant adverse environmental or social impacts.

Category B: The project activity will potentially cause minor social and environmental adverse impacts

Category C: The project activity will not cause any adverse social or environmental impacts.

The Impacts of Risks are described as follows.

- **Negligible**: Negligible or no adverse impacts on communities, individuals, and environment.
- **Minor**: Very limited impacts in terms of magnitude (e.g. small area affected, very low number of people affected) and duration, may be easily avoided, managed, mitigated.
- **Moderate**: Impacts of low magnitude, limited in scale (site-specific) and duration (temporary), can be avoided, managed or mitigated with relatively uncomplicated accepted measures
- **Severe**: Adverse impacts on people or environment of medium to large magnitude, spatial extent and duration more limited than critical (e.g. predictable, mostly temporary, reversible). The potential risk impacts of projects that may affect the human rights, lands, natural resources, territories, and traditional livelihoods of indigenous peoples are to be considered at a minimum, potentially severe.
- Critical: Significant adverse impacts on human populations or environment. Adverse impacts high in magnitude or spatial extent (e.g. large geographic area, large number of people, transboundary impacts, cumulative impacts) and duration (e.g. long-term, permanent and/or irreversible); areas impacted include areas of high value and sensitivity (e.g. valuable ecosystems, critical habitats); adverse impacts to rights, lands, resources and territories of indigenous peoples; involve significant displacement or resettlement; generates significant quantities of greenhouse gas emissions; impacts may give rise to significant social conflict.

The **Probability** of Risk is selected from the following choices: improbable, not likely, likely, probable, and expected.

The **Significance** of Risk is a product of the impact and probability of risks for each Safeguard Standard. The chart at the end of this section is used to determine the significance of risk for each Safeguard Standard by transferring the impact and probability of risks.

Regardless in which category a specific activity is screened, all environmental and social risks were adequately identified and assessed by the implementing entity in an open and transparent manner with appropriate consultation.

Impact assessment.

In the cases that during the screening process, there triggered an environmental or social risk by not complying with any of the Adaptation Funds Principle, the environmental and social assessment:

- i. Assessed the magnitude of the risk and the potential adverse effects of the proposed activity;
- ii. assessed alternatives to the proposed activity;
- iii. assessed possible measures to avoid, minimize, or mitigate environmental and social risks of the proposed activity.

The assessment have included a set of actions identifying the necessary measures to avoid, minimize, or mitigate the potential environmental and social risks.

Monitoring

During the implementation of the project, monitoring and evaluation of activities were addressed for all environmental and social risks identified during screening and assessment process and design, and any environmental and social management plan, including those measures required to avoid, minimize, or mitigate environmental and social risks.

Grievance Mechanism

The project have defined a grievance mechanism that provides people benefit by the project activities an accessible, transparent, fair and effective process for receiving and addressing their complaints about environmental or social harms caused by any the project activities.

Project description

The project objective is to "enhance the climate and disaster resilience of the most vulnerable human settlements in Southern Laos by increasing sustainable access to basic infrastructure systems and services, emphasizing resilience to storms, floods, droughts, landslides and disease outbreaks". It combines a number of horizontally and vertically interrelated policies, planning and capacity development initiatives and has at its core the delivery of resilient infrastructure and services in target settlements that are characterized by a high exposure to climate hazards.

Scope of the project

The project's main objective is to enhance the climate and disaster resilience of the most vulnerable rural and emerging urban human settlements in Southern Lao PDR by increasing sustainable access to basic infrastructure systems and services, emphasizing resilience to storms, floods, droughts, landslides and disease outbreaks.

To accomplish this, firstly the technical capacity of the government (national and local) in combination with establishing an enabling governance framework is required. Secondly, at the community level, inhabitants need to be enabled to plan for resilience, construct and maintain basic resilient infrastructure. This is mirrored in specific objectives 1 and 2 below. The 3rd specific objective below comprises the concrete part of adaptation measures: constructing climate and disaster resilient infrastructure systems in human settlements and strengthening the resilience of existing infrastructure systems.

- Component 1: Develop institutional capacities of the national government and local authorities to increase the resilience of human settlements and infrastructure systems.
- Component 2: Enable communities to improve their well-being/health conditions by developing local capacities and resilience strategies for their settlements and infrastructure systems
- Component 3: Enhance climate and disaster resilient infrastructure systems in human settlement.
- Component 4: Ensure project compliance with AF and UN-Habitat standards for knowledge Management and, Advocacy

Location

The target location has been 189 village across 17.500 km2 covering the districts of Ta oi and Samuoi in Saravane province; Kaleum and Dakcheung in Sekong Provinas; and Sanxay, Xaysetha, Samakkhixay and Phouvong in Attapeu province.



Methodology

Vulnerability Assessment

To ensure that projects and related activities enhance the climate and disaster resilience of vulnerable settlements it was necessary to conduct a vulnerability and risk assessment to better understand which are the climate change hazards, which areas are affected the most, and who are the people most affected by them and why.

The vulnerability assessment minimized social risks by targeting people in vulnerable situations and providing the opportunity to capture more detailed disaggregated data focusing on the needs and perceptions (e.g. women, youth, elderly people or people with disabilities). Vulnerability assessment also has the potential to capture detail information on natural habitats that can subsequently be used to minimize environmental risks.

During this first phase, an ESS strategy may be developed to adequately manage the compliance with safeguards and to lay the foundation for "Environmental and Social Safeguards thinking" throughout the entire process.

The vulnerability assessment provided the initial knowledge framework in which it will lay the environmental and social safeguard strategy.

Vulnerability is defined as the degree to which a system is susceptible to, and unable to cope with, adverse effects of climate change, including climate variability and extremes. Vulnerability is a function of exposure, sensitivity and adaptive capacity.

- **Exposure** is defined as the presence of people and systems, such as infrastructure and livelihoods, in places and settings that could be adversely affected.
- **Sensitivity** is defined as the degree of which people or systems are affected, either directly or indirectly, by climate variability or change.
- Adaptive capacity describes the ability of people and systems to adapt to potential impacts and consequences triggered by climate change and thereby taking advantage of opportunities that are linked to the changes.

In simple terms, vulnerability is heightened by increases in exposure and/or sensitivity, and by a reduction in sensitivity. Consequently, reducing people's vulnerability means some combination of reducing their exposure and/or sensitivity, or increasing their adaptive capacity.

To ensure that projects and related activities reduce climate disaster risks and climate change vulnerabilities of communities, it is necessary to conduct vulnerability and risk assessments to understand exactly which people and which areas are most at risk/vulnerable and why. This information was subsequently used to:

- Inform participatory action planning processes that lead to community driven and owned adaptation, as well as settlements upgrading processes
- Identify lower risk areas in which climate resilient infrastructure and housing could be constructed.
- Develop targeted early warning systems, training programs in environmental management and risk reduction, community capacity building, and alternative livelihood strategies.
- Select, prioritize and design appropriate resilient infrastructure development options.

To minimize social and environmental risks of projects, the vulnerability and risk assessments conducted were also used to collect information about potential risks (e.g. people in vulnerable situations; natural habitats). Specific vulnerability and risk assessments targeting people in vulnerable situations were necessary to capture more detailed disaggregated data focused on climate change related issues, needs and perceptions of specific groups such as women and youth with the aim to develop differentiated approaches to building resilience.

Data collection

The assessment was conducted using Kobo Toolbox, a free and open-source data collection suite developed by Harvard University in collaboration with the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA). The data was collected using tablets that allowed to minimize the time for data collection and ensure the integrity of the data. All the information was stored and managed in a central database.





The assessment's methodology was presented to stakeholders from all provinces at a workshop in Attapeu in August 2017, and training was conducted with the enumerators, who executed the survey. 32 enumerators were trained by the project and subsequently went to all 189 villages to gather data. The enumerators were mostly district-level government staff from the 8 target districts

Action planning

The information collected during the Vulnerability assessment contributes to the design of the action planning at the province, district and village level.

It was observed that for many villages due to the proximity with each other, shared similar characteristics as well as similar climate related hazards. In this regard, during the action planning it was determined to consider one small-scale infrastructure to benefit more than one village when feasible.

The action plan and the technical design of the different small-scale infrastructures took into consideration the priorities defined by the representative groups in the communities, the villages characteristics and the climate change hazards identified and the pertinence of the activity under the project framework.

The final decision on what activity would be implemented was agreed between all the stakeholders involved.

Environmental and social safeguards screening and management plan.

The environmental and social management plan was put in place during the implementation of components 1, 2 and 3 within the project circle.

Through participatory approach the project has been enhancing the capacities of the national, district and local authorities through a series of training focuses on screening process and reinforcing the capacities to identify potential environmental and social risks. These materials were produced in English and Lao language (Annex 1) to ensure the local authorities fully understood the importance of having a Environmental and Social Management plan in place

All the target villages were visited while conducted the assessment, the implementing partner was instructed to apply a participatory approach where all the incumbent stakeholders were present, ensuring the participation of all vulnerable groups such as women, children, elder people, people living with disabilities and representatives of different ethnic groups present in the village.

Following previous training on data collection using mobile technology, district officials involved in the technical design of the small-scale infrastructure were instructed on how to conduct the environmental and social screening questionnaire (Annex 2). The resulting environmental and social screening reports wer signed by the project manager and the monitoring and evaluation officer and approved by the district government officials. (Annex 3)

In consultation with all the affected groups in the village, the technical design was shared, and the screening questionnaire was applied. The questionnaire was design in a way that if any of the

principles is triggered, automatically it was requested to describe why this particular principle was trigger and immediately discuss, define and agree with the villagers the mitigation measures that will be putting in place to avoid unnecessary harm to the community.

All the principles triggered and the mitigation measures put in place on site were collected and systematized in a follow up document that helped to track each one of the potential environmental and social hazards in each one of the activities throughout the project (Annex 4).





This mitigation measures were incorporated in the environmental and social management plan and were further used as supporting document in the redefinition of the technical design that led the final implementation of the activity.
